Some Changes in the Works...

The Continuing Education and Community Engagement unit at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside is going through a transition to separate programming. Community Engagement will move to the main campus at some point this academic year and Continuing Education (CE) will remain at Talent Hall. **The Adventures in Lifelong Learning program will continue to operate in partnership with CE.** Campus leadership is working with the CE director to refine the transition and decide upon a new name for the unit. Some of the services will be impacted due the transition. Although it's near and dear to our hearts, we have made the decision to begin to sunset the Mini Courses program and offer limited classes in the academic year 2017-18. It is undecided if CE will be the home for future youth programs as well. It is our hope that we retain this programming going forward. CE will support the campus by adding pre-counseling services adult degree completion programs and other for adult centered programming such as conferences, certificate programs, and other professional skill development programs. **We will continue to offer the Aging Well conference and other educational community events.** We are happy to continue partnering with ALL, as we feel this program is deeply connected to the CE core mission that is centered on life-long learning. 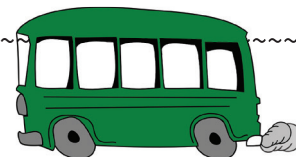

In Memoriam



Florence Wesselius, 1922 - 2017

Florence Paul Wesselius passed away peacefully in her sleep on June 2, 2017, at Brookside Care Center from complications of Alzheimer's disease.

Florence was a well-known presence with the ALL community. She became coordinator of adult education for Gateway and was instrumental in helping to establish programs for adult learners throughout the state. She received numerous awards from Gateway and other organizations for her work. She retired in 1988.

Florence came to Kenosha in 1953 when her husband, Zeke, had been offered a construction job, and they became founding members of Wesley United Methodist Church. When Zeke was killed in a car accident in 1955, Florence had decided she needed to get an education if she was going to support her family. She enrolled at Kenosha Vocational School, which would later become Gateway Technical College. Despite interruptions in her education for children and her marriage to Art, she eventually completed her two-year degree and taught for a few years. She also worked as a bookkeeper. She later earned a Bachelor's Degree from UW-Parkside and then a Master's Degree from UW-Madison.
