Our Guest Speaker:

PETER CHIAPPORI

While Peter Chiappori is a licensed architect in Illinois & Wisconsin, he is currently the archivist for two tombs, KV-10 & KV-63, in the Valley of the Kings. KV-63 was discovered in 2006 by Dr. Otto Schaden, the mission director of the Amenmesse Project and one of the most prolific modern excavators in the Valley. Peter is also a team member on the current KV-10 excavations working with Dr. Salima Ikram, the new mission director since Dr. Schaden's passing in 2015. His area of expertise is deciphering hieratic texts, acting as field architect, artist and sole archivist for the mission. currently he is in the



process of preparing the finds of the Amenmesse Project for publication.

Peter reads hieroglyphs and hieratic and has been an independent scholar of Egyptology for decades. When in high school he was asked by the Oriental Institute to tutor their first-year Egyptian language students by then director Frank Yurko. Peter has taught many classes at the Kenosha Public museum over the last decade including Beginning Hieroglyphs, Religious History, Pyramids, Tombs, Temples, Mummification, Pharaonic Chronology, and the current topics, and is a past lecturer for A.L.L.
