

## Transfer Guide for Music Majors

### 1. Application Procedure

UW System application is required for admission to the university, along with official high school and all college transcripts. To apply, visit <https://apply.wisconsin.edu>. Transfer students must audition for admission to the Music Department. Auditions are held in February, March, May, and August. Based on the audition, transcript evaluation, and music faculty advising, transfer students will be placed at the appropriate level of applied music instruction, music theory and piano class. ### 2. Transfer Policies

Transfer degree seeking student must earn a minimum of 30 of their last 60 credits at UW-Parkside toward their degree to fulfill the residency requirement. Individual departments and programs may require that certain courses be taken at UW-Parkside. Students transferring from non-baccalaureate institutions to UW baccalaureate-granting institutions may generally transfer up to 72 credits earned at non-baccalaureate institutions toward the 120 credits required for degree completion. UW institutions may accept additional credits toward the degree where appropriate.

### 3. Requirements for the Music Major (61-90 credits)

The following common requirements are in addition to the university general education requirements.

Music students may apply MUSI 104 and 3 credits of MUSP 102 towards General Education Credits

\*Completion of second semester of the 300 level (appropriate to the student's principal instrument) is required.

Concurrent registration in Large Ensemble appropriate to the student's principal instrument is required.

\*\*Enrollment in the Large Ensemble appropriate to the student's principal instrument is required for majors for every semester of full-time enrollment.

**Applied Music Requirement:** Private Instruction in music performance is available to music majors and minors under the prefix MUSA, for applied music. Concurrent registration in an academic course in music and appropriate large ensemble are required.

Instruction is offered in piano, organ, trumpet, horn, trombone, baritone, tuba, violin, viola, cello, string bass, classical guitar, harp, harpsichord, flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone, bassoon, voice, and percussion. Consult the Music Department Chair for details. Successful completion of a full faculty jury is required for enrollment at the 300 level. **Large Ensemble Requirement:** While all students are encouraged to play and/or sing in departmental large ensembles, the department requires all applied music students (full-time and part-time) to participate in an ensemble. Large ensemble graduation requirement is 8 credits for all music majors

#### **Concentrations in Music**

- Music Performance Concentration (20-22 credits) - Audition required at the end of Sophomore Level
- Jazz Studies and Performance Concentration (24 credits) - Audition required at the end of Sophomore Level
- Music Education: Choral and General Music (55 credits) \*Interview/academic evaluation required
- Music Education: Instrumental and General Music (55 credits) \*Interview/academic evaluation required
- Liberal Arts Concentration (15 credits)

#### **FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT**

Must be fulfilled by one of the following options:

- two years of one language in high school with a grade of C or better in the second year of the language
- complete course at 104 level or above at UW-Parkside (or equivalent)
- 2 college semesters of one foreign language from an accredited institution

#### **ETHNIC DIVERSITY REQUIREMENT**

Any UWP course or equivalency with the (DV) designation meets UW-P's ethnic diversity requirement.

#### **GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENT**

1. **HUMANITIES AND ARTS:** 12 Credits required from at least three different departments/programs
2. **SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCE:** 12 Credits required from at least three different departments/programs
3. **NATURAL SCIENCE** - 12 Credits required from at least three different departments/programs
